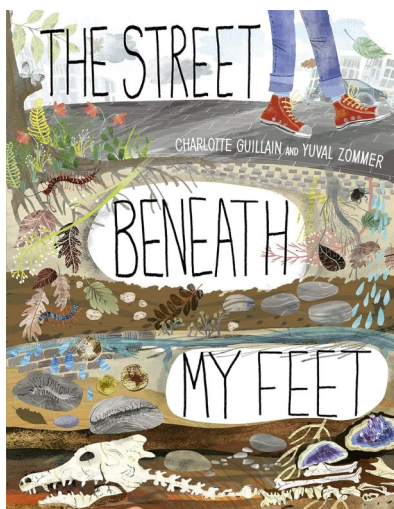

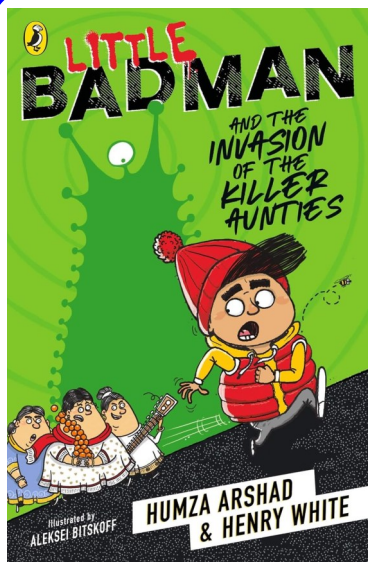
Book Reviews

CLASS ASSEMBLY



5K

In 5K's class assembly they opened up with an explanation of perimeter and area and how to find each one in rectangles. They then showed us some of their English learning which was focused on Shakespeare and his plays which culminated in some children acting out a scene from Romeo and Juliet. After that they talked about different states of matter which they had been focusing on in science, more specifically rust and how it affects metal. They then talked about climate change and some of the ways they could help by limiting the wasting of resources in school. They then went over some of the learning we have done in French which was places in town which they demonstrated. Finally, they finished by performing a piece of jazz music on the glockenspiels.

4J

4J shared their learning. They sang a twelve times table song. They shared art, DT light designs and science posters. They read some English descriptions of people and places and showed how to accurately punctuate speech. They finished by singing the song STOP.

5B

In their recent assembly, 5B shared their learning with us. They began explaining how they have been looking at the works of Shakespeare – Romeo and Juliet and Macbeth. They furthered their understanding on writing relative clauses and using relative pronouns as well as investigating idioms and neologisms. We were treated to a fabulous quiz of neologisms from famous authors. Next we were told how they have been making links with their knowledge of fractions and decimals when learning about percentages and their equivalencies. Next we learned about what they have found about Climate Change and saw the wonderful 'Rubbish Whale' they created. They also explained about their Science learning, in helping festival organisers investigating a range of properties of materials for various purposes. 5B demonstrated the different dances they have been learning in PE from the 1940' era. They are looking forward to creating their own dance using elements from each dance they have learned about. The class proudly shared their Art sketches from their Art unit, where they developed their use a variety of media: pencil, pen and charcoal for drawing, using Fry as a stimulus. Drawing the assembly to a close, 5B told us about their Music lessons where they had been studying the song 'Fell My Love by Adele'. The grand finale was marvellous performance of 'Feel My Love.

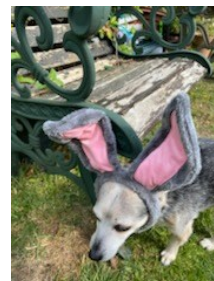

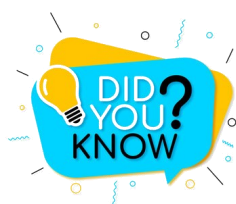

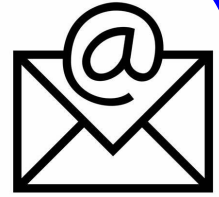
Dogs and coat colour development

Is my child too ill for school?



It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or play-group when they're unwell.

There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about [managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk/managing-specific-infectious-diseases). These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school or nursery on the first day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason. If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.
