
## Book Reviews

## CLASS ASSEMBLY



## **5**B

In their recent assembly, 5B shared their learning with us. They began explaining how they have been looking at the works of Shakespeare Romeo and Juliet and Macbeth. They furthered their understanding on writing relative clauses and using relative pronouns as well as investigating idioms and neologisms. We were treated to a fabulous quiz of neologisms from famous authors. Next we were told how they have been making links with their knowledge of fractions and decimals when learning about percentages and their equivalencies. Next we learned about what they have found about Climate Change and saw the wonderful 'Rubbish Whale' they created. They also explained about their Science learning, in helping festival organisers investigating a range of properties of materials for various purposes. 5B demonstrated the different dances they have been learning in PE from the 1940' era. They are looking forward to creating their own dance using elements from each dance they have learned about. The class proudly shared their Art sketches from their Art unit, where they developed their use a variety of media: pencil, pen and charcoal for drawing, using Fry as a stimulus. Drawing the assembly to a close, 5B told us about their Music lessons where they had been studying the song 'Fell My Love by Adele'. The grand finale was marvellous performance of 'Feel My Love.


Our assembly this term was jam packed full of exciting new learning that we loved to share with our parents. We shared examples of writing from our Harry Potter unit: instruction text about Quidditch and a formal letter in the form of a Howler. We shared our Topic learning all about climate change and how we researched the impact and effects of climate change on endangered species around the world. In Science we explained about our learning in Light and how we made our own periscopes to test the theory of light travelling in straight lines. In Art, we showed our final pieces inspired by Alfred Wallis and showcased our skills such as fine line pen drawing, adding colour and texture and printing over materials. We shared our current dancing through the decades PE unit, showing everyone how we twist, mashed potato and finger pointed our way through the 70s and 80s. Finally, as part of Music, we improvised and composed a piece of music alongside the infamous rock band Journey to the song Don't Stop Believing.





As part of our Climate Change project, our children have shown some real passion for activism and making a difference for their future. As a result, we have arranged for them to take part in the 'Walk for Water' challenge. The children will be walking around the playground for up to 15 minutes for 5 days over a 2-week period 17<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> March to empathise with those who are struggling as a result of Climate Change.

The walk is to raise awareness and money for women and girls from around the world who are being held back by having to walk 5km or more for water every day, taking away their hopes for the future as they miss out on paid work or school.

Additionally, as 'World Water Day' is on March 22<sup>nd</sup>, they will also be learning about and raising awareness of the need for glacier preservation. World Water Day celebrates water and raises awareness of the 2.2 billion people living without access to safe water. It is about taking action to tackle the global water crisis. A core focus of World Water Day is to support the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030. World Water Day 2025 focuses on glacier preservation, emphasising the need for global action to manage meltwater sustainably and reduce emissions, securing vital water resources for the future.






Our Spring Attendance Challenge begun on Monday 13th January. This will run until the end of term. All children with 100% attendance and in school on time will be awarded with a certificate.

#### Year 3

Fry joined year 3 for their science investigation into how different surfaces can create different amounts of friction. As part of our investigation we learned how Formula 1 circuits use different surfaces to increase or decrease the amount of friction on the car's tyres in order to slow them down. To test this theory we used a toy car and a ramp. Fry pushed the car down the ramp to see how far the car would travel before stopping on different surface. We tested the car on the smooth wooden floor, the bumpy carpet and the rough grass outside. Fry helped us discover that the wooden floor created the least friction because it was smooth so the car travelled further.



#### **Keep Those Easter Treats Out of Reach!**

While Easter is filled with delicious goodies, many of the items we enjoy can be harmful—or even toxic to our dogs. Please take extra care during this time and keep the following in mind:

Chocolate Easter Eggs: Chocolate is highly toxic to dogs, so it's essential to keep any chocolate treats, including Easter eggs, well out of their reach. Be cautious with chocolate wrappers too, as they may contain small bits that can harm your dog if ingested.

Easter Baskets: It's tempting to let your dog explore the holiday goodies, but Easter baskets may contain wrapped items like macadamia nuts, fruit cakes, or other treats that are unsafe for dogs.

Make sure baskets are placed in areas your dog can't access.

Hot Cross Buns: Hot cross buns, especially those that contain raisins or currants, should be kept away from your dog. Grapes and raisins are toxic to dogs and can cause kidney failure, so please avoid sharing them.

Roast Dinners: While we all love a festive roast, certain ingredients can cause abdominal pain in dogs. Avoid feeding your dog from the table, especially foods that may contain harmful spices, onions, or garlic.
