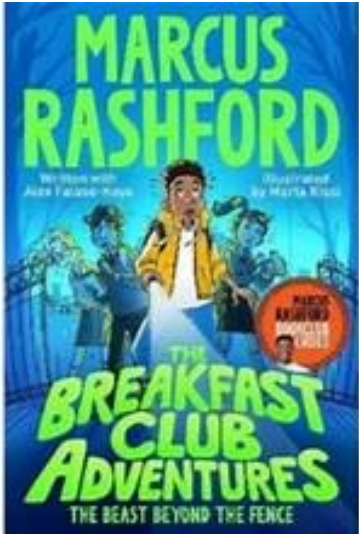

Book Reviews

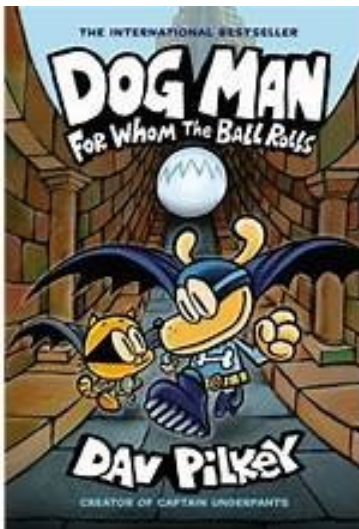
The Breakfast Club Adventures- a Marcus Rashford story

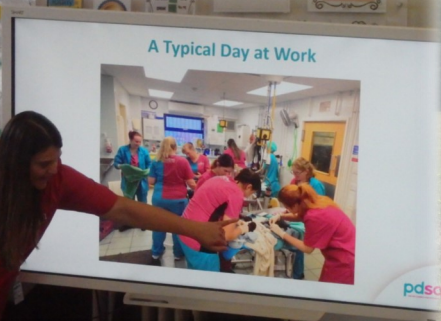


ASPIRATIONS WEEK

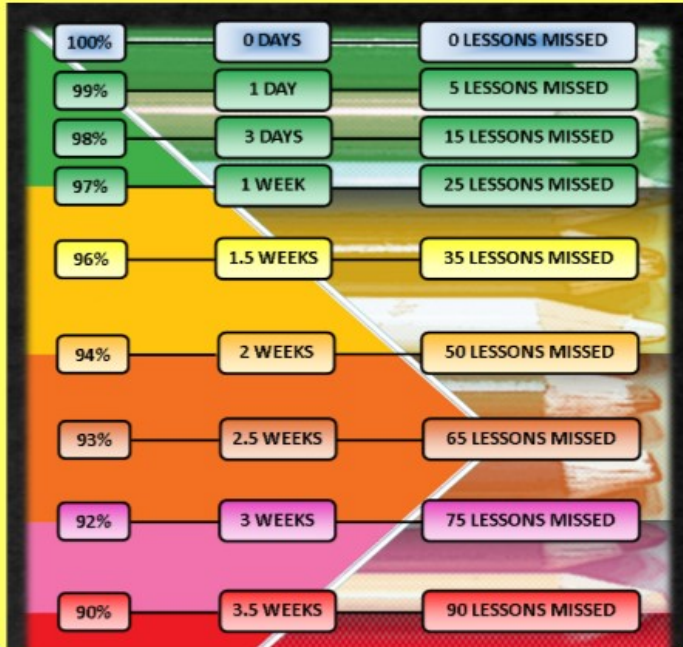
