

We shared our learning in Math's, English, Science and Geography. We also sang some wonderful songs we have learnt.

In 2M's class assembly we invited parents for a journey into "Our Wonderful World". We sung song's which showed our learning of the continents and the oceans. We displayed some of our practice artwork inspired by L. S. Lowry. We shared some of our knowledge of place value that we have learnt in Math's. Finally, we ended on a song- "What a Wonderful World" by Louis Armstrong.

Our class assembly showcased what we have learnt so far in Year 6 starting off with our recount English unit where we wrote about a day in the life of Fry. We then shared the beginning of our new fantasy fiction unit all about Northern Lights by Phillip Pullman. We shared our knowledge all about South America and updating our place and location knowledge. We then linked this to our Art learning, all based around different artists from the continent: Freda Kahlo, Diego Riviera and Torres Garcia.

We crossed the pavement to see the sorting office, health centres and library which we can not wait to visit with our families.

## Fireworks frighten animals

Fireworks can be a source of fear for many animals but it doesn have to be that way. Don't ignore the problem – follow our top tips to make fireworks celebrations less frightening for your pets.

#### Keeping pets secure


Give your cat or dog somewhere to hide that they have access to at all times, e.g. under furniture or in a quiet corner.

Walk dogs during daylight hours. Keep dogs and cats indoors when fireworks are likely to be set off. At
nightfall close
windows and curtains.
Put on music to mask
the sound of
fireworks.

Make sure your pet can't escape if there's a sudden noise. Have them microchipped just in case.

Never
punish your pets
when they are scared
as this will only make
things worse in
the long run.

It's fine to comfort your pet if it helps them relax, or leave them alone unless you think they will harm themselves.

#### Just for dogs

Close any windows and black out a 'doggy play area' so that your dog can't see the flashing lights. Ignore the fireworks yourself.
Play with a toy to see if your dog
wants to join in, but don't force them

Before fireworks begin, move your dog to the doggy play area with all their favourite toys.

Ask your vet for advice about pheromone diffusers and being referred to a clinical animal behaviourist for help.



#### Don't forget small animals





Make sure your cat has somewhere to hide if they want to. For example under some furniture, in a cardboard box or in a quiet corner. Don't try to tempt your cat out as this will cause them to become more stressed.

If your pets live outside, partly cover cages, pens and aviaries with blankets so that one area is well sound-proofed. Make sure that your pets are still able to look out. Provide lots of extra bedding so your pets have something to burrow in.

Children will be escorted to their classes at 8.40 by a member of staff.


Breakfast club places need to be booked and paid for via the school money website. £2.50 per day from September 2024.
