

# **3SO**

In Math's we have been looking at fractions. We have learnt what unit fractions and non-unit fractions are. We have added fractions together and we have looked at whole numbers.

In English, we have been looking at instructions and imperative verbs aka bossy verbs. We wrote our own instructions for games shows.

Science, we have been learning about light and how light travels and makes shadows. We also have been learning about magnets, how they can attract and repel depending on the poles.


