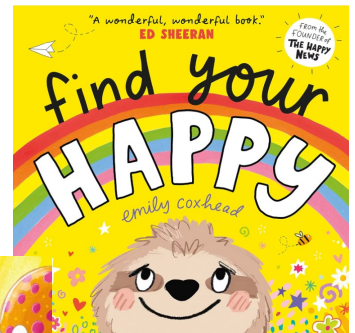
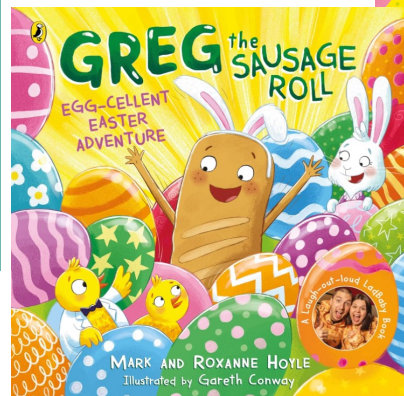

Science, we have been learning about light and how light travels and makes shadows. We also have been learning about magnets, how they can attract and repel depending on the poles.

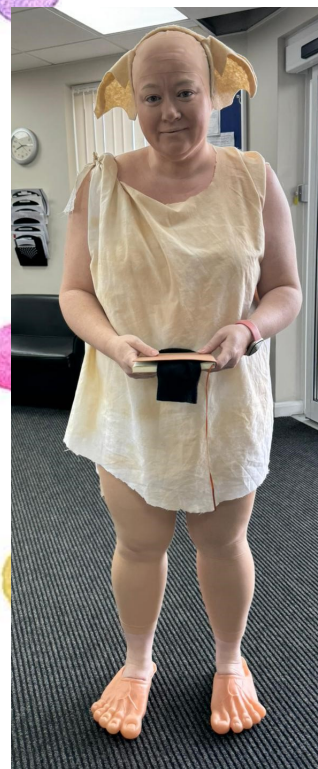
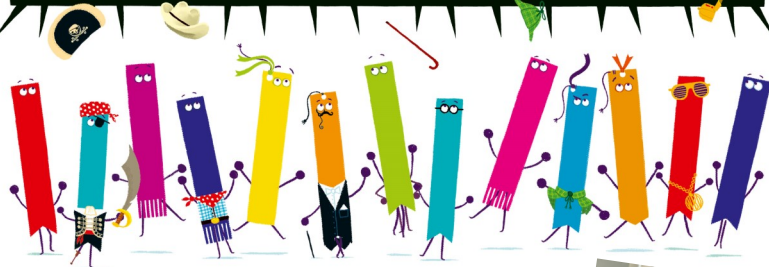
French, we have been describing people, things and animals. Fry visited us in class and we described him. We also sang our song counting to 10.
